


How effective do you think the existing signage is at encouraging locals and visitors to explore Totnes and fully engage with the towns offers and events?



- Need more smart noticeboards for poster display



Many comments where the same, the below are a few examples which illustrate common themes:

- Visit Totnes website / Web / Social Media
- Word of mouth / Verbally
- For most visitors we direct them a certain distance up/down Fore/High Street and indicate the **shop/business** at the turning point if their destination is off this road or give examples of businesses that tell them they have gone too far along.
- Better signage for east gate and north gate and the **castle** and narrows and **townhall square**. The tourist brown signs don't hit the eye
- I like the **planters**, more of those
- All directions start from the Seven Stars
- Reference from Fore Street/High Street or The Plains and lefts and rights
- Using shops as landmarks
- By street names and notable buildings and places, such as "Barrel House", "The Rotherfold" the "Old Bridge" etc.
- Using next left first right that sort of thing, but signs mounted to different coloured posts would be handy, like turn left at the green signpost
- Finger posts. Directions from the Plains and the station and using St Mary's,
 The Arch, and the Market Place.
- Describe the route via local landmarks, e.g. the old bridge, the Plains, the Seven Stars, Fore St, East Gate arch, High Street, the church, the market place
- As 90% of the shops are on one street I don't feel the need to direct customers.
 Totnes Castle- up the hill and follow the signs

- Signposting through landmarks
- I use the arch as a reference to most directions I give.
- I'd tell people to walk up and down the **high St** and look out for & explore the little alleyways
- Totnes is small, and everything on or not far from one street. Most everyone will have used the internet to locate harder to find locations
- We describe where we are using the **street** and postcode, and proximity to well known **landmarks**.
- Sending people to Leechwell usually requires the assistance of a map and d escriptive **geographic markers**
- The Curator At the bottom of the **high street**, just off the mini roundabout, with seating outside.
- Typically give directions from the **monument** at the bottom of the roundabout or from **Market Square**.
- The **civic square** is the key signage hub. From there you can sign people to the parks and gardens, riverside, and so on, with things to explore along the way.
- Below or above the clock tower/ in the narrows / Up/Down the hill/ near a specific landmark.
- Screen based / digital signage should be implemented
- The Narrows has no signage. We tell them to go to top of town. Poor
