4. SOUTH WEST WATER CONSULTATION

To consider the South West Water 'Draft Water Resources Management Plan (2024)' and make a recommendation (through the Town Matters Committee) to Full Council [consultation closes on 9th May].

To **RECOMMEND** to Full Council (subject to any additions by the Town Matters Committee) the following response to the South West Water Draft Water Management Plan 2024 consultation:

- The Council believes that South West Water should be a statutory consultee as part of the planning process and would support changes in planning legislation to enable this.
- The Council believes that there should be a further consultation on the South West Water Drainage and Wastewater Management Plan consulted on in 2022.

Environmental

- Extreme Weather Events no details given to the effects of extreme weather events and the effects on water treatment plants, how South West Water will respond, how to handle run off and slowing water flows down (for example through tree planting, attenuation ponds).
- Water Quality no detail is given about water quality monitoring, frequency of monitoring and what is being tested for (for example, nitrates, pollutants, plastics, antibiotics) particularly in relation to bathing water areas.
- Biodiversity no details are given on the wildlife species currently supported which therefore gives no baseline to monitor improvement or deterioration against.
- Future Modelling Tools would like to see the use of future modelling of the impacts of river water levels in drought and flood conditions and the environmental and biodiversity effects.
- Catchment Management no detail of how this strategic approach is taken into account in plans and programmes to assess and address the effects of run-off from agriculture and developed areas.
- All sewage treatment should be designed to include anaerobic digestion waste systems to support energy production, address climate change and prevent sewage discharges into rivers and the sea. (this could be combined with agricultural slurry treatment in rural areas).

Developments

- Flood Risk Modelling The plan should include flood risk modelling for any new development and the potential effect on neighbouring areas and river catchment from surface water run-off.
- Water Treatment South West Water needs to take into consideration the cumulative impact of various housing developments in a water catchment area in terms of: provision of potable water, capacity of water treatment plants to process the sewage and grey water generated, flood risk from non-permeable surfaces, and run-off effects into rivers.
- Water Management Infrastructure New developments should install separate sewage and rain water systems to lessen the volume of water passing through the waste water treatment process, and natural soakaway areas within the site of any new development should be insisted upon.
- Grey Water Management could the water companies insist on all new housing developments to be fitted with grey water harvesting for use in the home (for example toilet flushing, water butt collection) to reduce the volume of water consumption required per capita and support increased drought resilience?
- South West Water should be empowered to refuse additional developments loading onto the system where capacity for the provision of potable water and/or sewage treatment has been reached and can be demonstrated.

PROPOSED TELECOMMUNICATIONS INSTALLATION AT HEAD RUDDY, BABBAGE ROAD, TOTNES, TQ9 5JA. NGR: 280374E, 061050N.

We act for Atlas Tower Group who intend to install a telecommunications base station at the above location.

Atlas Tower Group wish to erect a new site at this location to facilitate additional coverage and capacity requirements, incorporating new technologies. The NPPF sets out the Government's general overview regarding supporting high quality communications infrastructure, recognising that advanced, high-quality communications infrastructure is essential for sustainable economic growth.

Base stations use radio signals to connect mobile devices and phones to the network, enabling to send and receive; calls, texts, emails, pictures, web, TV and downloads. Without base stations, mobile devices and phones will not work.

Many other everyday items also use radio signals to send and receive information, such as televisions and radio broadcasting equipment and two-way radio communications. Base stations are connected to each other and telephone exchange buildings by cables or wireless technology such as microwave dishes, to create the network. The area each base station covers is called a "cell". Each cell overlaps with its neighbouring cells to create a continuous network. The size and shape of each cell is determined by the features of the surrounding area, such as buildings, trees and hills which can block signals. When people travel between cells, the signal is transferred between base stations without a break in service. Each base station covers a certain area only handle a limited number of calls at once. As mobile phones and devices become more popular, more base stations are needed to ensure continuous coverage.

This letter therefore invites you, in accordance with planning policy guidance and the Best Practice Commitments, to enter into pre-application discussions with regard to our preferred site option prior to formal planning submissions. Several steps in the site identification process have already been undertaken. The Local Planning Authority mast register and our records of other potential sites have been reviewed, the policies in the Development Plan have been taken into account and we have examined the inter-operator site sharing database. As Atlas Tower Group is seeking to propose a multi-operator site-sharing solution, in this instance it is considered that the optimum solution would be the installation of a new site.

The site is located at Head Ruddy, Babbage Road, Totnes, TQ9 5JA, which is an industrial area to the north of Totnes. While none of the nearby buildings are suitable for hosting telecommunications equipment, the chosen location is bounded on two sides by 18m tall trees and located as unobtrusively in the corner of the industrial estate as possible.

The height of the proposed apparatus is the minimum capable of providing the technological improvements sought whilst achieving ICNIRP compliance. It should be noted that the new technologies will provide high-quality communications infrastructure essential for economic growth as sought by the NPPF.

The proposal will include the installation of a 22.5m lattice tower, 3 no. antenna apertures, 4 no. 600mm microwave transmission dishes and 8 no. equipment cabinets inside an $11.6m \times 6.5m$ compound enclosed by a 1.8m high chain link fence with gate and development ancillary thereto.

It is imperative that support is given to the introduction of new infrastructure to allow new technology which will allow networks to be able to handle more data and connect more devices simultaneously at much faster speeds. This will enable places to remain competitive and will support the Government's ambition for the UK to become a world leader in telecommunications technologies and development. It should be noted that the new technologies will provide advanced high-quality communications infrastructure essential for economic growth as sought by the NPPF. Any perceived negative impacts will be far outweighed by the overall benefits of the scheme and the proposal as a multi-operator site-sharing solution will limit unnecessary proliferation of telecommunications equipment in the area.

All Atlas Tower Group installations are designed to be fully compliant with the public exposure guidelines established by the International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP). These guidelines have the support of UK Government, the European Union and they also have the formal backing of the World Health Organisation.

We enclose a copy of our plans and would welcome your suggestions. We look forward to receiving your response within 14 days of the date of this letter.







1. Introductions

- a. Brief introductions and apologies

 - SO gave brief update on phase 2 of the wayfinding project. This can be found in Appendix A. Cllr Sweett highlighted the need for a fingerpost sign on the old bridge directing to the river walk to Dartington, there is space on existing post.
 - ACTION: SO to pass this information on to TTC Marketing Manager.

2. Terms of Reference update

- The Chair introduced the draft ToRs that had been circulated amongst the Steering Group prior to the meeting and invited comments
- VC asked for clarification around whether Totnes Town Council Planning Committee would *note* or *approve* amendments made to ToRs (ToRs state that they note)
 - SO explained that as the Forum/Steering Group is an advisory body to the town council and not a sub-committee / not set up by TTC, the Planning Committee (and Full Council) are not required to approve changes.
- No other comments or amendments were requested
- The Steering Group unanimously voted to adopt the new Terms of Reference

3. 'New' process discussion

 SO briefly ran through the proposed process that had been circulated to the SG several weeks prior, outlined below:

Email DCC proposing the following:

- a. Update the issues/schemes section of the Transport Strategy (with help of hotspot map for reference)
- b. Prioritise these issues/schemes (using DCC provided criteria)
- c. Work with DCC on developing the top 5 issues/schemes further.

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This email would include asking for guidance on what criteria we should use to prioritise. If they disagree with the proposal, ask for guidance on what they recommend instead.

While awaiting DCC approval, we can still add any issues/schemes to the Strategy that we think are needed as this should be done either way.

- DCC were emailed with the above suggestions. We received a very positive reply from Meg Booth (Director of Climate Change, Environment and Transport at DCC) who agreed with the process and put us in touch with another DCC officer who can help us with guidance on criteria.
- This process was added to the agenda for this meeting after some concerns were raised by SG members regarding wider community engagement in the process.
- Discussion around the hotspot map and community engagement
 - VC felt the wider community should be enabled to comment on the map get wider engagement, show desire to include people
 - Acknowledged issues with time, resources and cost but said some of SG happy to volunteer their time
 - The issue of consultation fatigue was raised. Residents are extremely fed up
 of being asked about traffic but nothing ever really happening. We need to be
 wary of this.
 - It was also pointed out that the SG is supposed to be a representative group of the town and so can, to a degree, make recommendations on its behalf.
 - It was also noted that extending out widely risks more stalemate/inaction due to a wide range of opinions. Having a representative Steering Group can help avoid this to a degree.
 - It was suggested that the hotspot map could be a living document accessible for a longer period of time in which residents/stakeholders can add comments at any time.
 - Discussion around how to enable comments
 - Google My Maps with linked Google Form

- It was agreed that the hotspot map should be presented at the Forum meeting in April (26th).
- It was agreed that it would be helpful to have a timeline for the draft/finished strategy to take to DCC
 - September/October agreed as deadline for completing the Strategy update
 - Needs to be considered by TTC beforehand so ready to go to HATOC in November.
 - July deadline for draft for TTC

ACTION: SO to draft timeline of stages (when to go where, process, consultative stages - a few milestones) and liaise with Cllr Hodgson, SC and VC

ACTION: SO to reorder the hotspot map so that things are structured on the left according to area

ACTION: SO to discuss with TB re best set up for map/comments using Google My Maps / Forms

ACTION: SO to add another layer to map for EV chargepoints

ACTION: Contemplate creating a map overview of the schemes in the Transport Strategy (once updated)

ACTION: SO to think about how to get more people to the Forum

ACTION: SO/GB to think about creating a communications strategy

ACTION: SO to speak to Town Clerk about setting up a Special Forum for wider input into

the hotspot map, using April Forum as test run

4. Planning decisions elsewhere affecting Totnes

- VC shared concerns around planning decisions elsewhere affecting traffic in Totnes but this not being taken into consideration
 - a. Green light for housing in Paignton will add to traffic pressures in Totnes:

 - We don't have legal standing, political power, etc. but we should still
 make a statement about impact that these developments have on us
 - We do have moral power to voice our concerns
 - This could be shared more widely, local newspapers (including Torbay, etc).
- Some Section 106 money from Paignton projects should be coming to us. But current regulation doesn't allow this.
- DCC does have a responsibility to consider strategically and across the board. Does it do so properly?

ACTION: SC to draft some text for the group to consider

5. Traffic Strategy update discussion

SO asked for comments on the draft Strategy update.

• NB: This currently only includes updates to the schemes in the appendix rather than any updates to the policy and strategy text.

Comments made:

- Cut-through traffic needing to be dealt with holistically
 - o This issue needs to be added to the strategy text
- It would be useful to have a glossary defining terms
 - E.g., "Town Centre" is mentioned but needs to be defined
- Document doesn't currently reflect changes to driver behaviour
 - o Satnavs quieter routes are being used more
- Documents referred to are out of date and don't reflect the latest thinking

- Access for All section it feels too all-encompassing, doesn't feel like we are expressing our view of what we want for the town
- 3.2 Air travel why is this mentioned?
- Add signage issues / improvement to the short-term schemes
- We need to define the boundaries / scope of the document
 - Suggestion to add two maps one showing boundary of document, the other showing linking roads/routes (e.g. Exeter, Torbay, Plymouth, Dartmouth, Kinsbridge)
- Is population growth mentioned in it?
- Suggestion to remove scheme B5 as we want to be encouraging cycling and the section in question does not have any issues.

ACTION: SO to try to incorporate these comments into Strategy

ACTION: SO to look into how to colour code comments so iterations are clear

ACTION: ALL, email comments to SO by 5 April so it can be fed into next iteration of the

Strategy

• It was agreed that the Forum in April should look at the hotspots map (and add in anything that's missing) and headlines of the Traffic Strategy (with comments from this meeting added)

- o Starting with small groups concentrating on their specific locations.
- Checking correct info given.
- Concluding with proposals as to how this could be carried into the Strategy.
- o All to support further consultation at a wider Forum meeting.
- It was agreed that the April Forum should be a hybrid meeting to enable as many to attend as possible
